These awards began in 1984 and are given to the PGA Professional, Woman PGA Professional (Board Meeting, Jan. 2018) and Senior PGA Professional Players of the Year. The winners are determined over a period from January 1 through December 31.

A PGA member will not be eligible to win any category of the PGA Professional Player of the Year Award if:

- a) The member has played in more than eight (8) combined Adams Pro Tour (ATP), Asian Tour, Australia/New Zealand Tour, Dakotas Tour, European Challenge Tour, European Senior Tour, European Tour, JPGA Senior Tour, JPGA Tour, Ladies European Tour (LET), Symetra Tour (LPGA), LPGA Tour, Mackenzie TOUR-Canada, PGA TOUR, PGA TOUR Champions, PGA TOUR-China, PGA TOUR-LatinoAmerica, SwingThought Tour, The Safari Tour, The Sunshine Tour and web.com TOUR tournaments **between January 1 and December 31** in the same calendar year. The U.S. Open, U.S. Senior Open, U.S. Women's Open, PGA Championship, KitchenAid Senior PGA Championship and KPMG Women's PGA Championship are not included in the 8-tournament count;
- b) At any point in the year the member is suspended from membership;
- c) At any point in the year the member is suspended from tournament participation for either National or Section Tournaments; or
- d) The member is classified as Class F, RM, LMC, Reserve (formerly Inactive), A-3, or Honorary;
- e) The member has not played in at least one Section event plus one National event, or two Section events during the same year. (Board Meeting, March 2015)

The following point system (which includes adjustments thereafter) was adopted at the November 1992 Board Meeting. Below is a record of adjustments since 1992:

- Effective January 1, 2002, web.com TOUR points became awarded on the basis of each tournament, rather than based on finish on the final money list. Reason: The PGA TOUR discontinued 3-5 "National" spots in every tournament in 2001, so players could play in up to 10 of these events in a year and stockpile points which might unfairly affect the final POY results. (PGA Tournament Department, July 2001).
- Effective January 1, 2009, no player in PGA TOUR, PGA TOUR Champions, web.com TOUR or LPGA Tour tournaments, who gains access into any such event through their conditional status, events played status, cuts made, money list status, prior tournament finishes or tournament win status, can earn PGA Professional Player of the Year or PGA Senior Professional Player of the Year points for that event. (Annual Meeting, November 2008) Also effective January 1, 2009, the following points modifications were made: US Open/British Open, 1st place points increased from 800 to 1,000; PGA Championship, 1st place points increased from 800 to 1,000; PGA Professional Championship, 1st place points increased from 400 to 500; Winter Championship Stroke Play Championship, 1st place points increased from 200 to 250, 2nd place points decreased from 185 to 175, 3rd place points decreased from 170 to 165 and 4th place points decreased from 160 to 155. Points modifications were also made for the following Senior events: US Senior Open, 1st place points increased from 400 to 500; Senior PGA Professional Championship, 1st place points

were increased from 200 to 250; Winter Championships Senior Stroke Play Championship, 1st place points increased from 100 to 125. (Board Meeting, February 2009)

- Effective January 1, 2013, points for the PGA Winter Championships (Senior Stroke Play and Stroke Play) and PGA Tournament Series were reduced by 50% of their 2012 value (Board Meeting, Nov. 2012).
- Effective 2015, a 10% points reduction for all PGA TOUR, PGA TOUR Champions and web.com TOUR events was approved. (Board Meeting, March 2015).

A* – Points diminish in two-point increments for everyone making the cut.

B* – Points diminish in one-point increments for everyone making the 54-hole cut.

C* – Everyone making the 36-hole cut receives a minimum of 10 points.

D* – Points diminish in one-point increments for everyone making the cut.

Section Performance. These points are based on each Section’s “Player of the Year” point standings with an additional 100 points awarded to the Section Champion only in each Section. (It was decided in July 1999 to award a similar 100 points to the winner (only) of all 41 Section PGA Professional Championships.)

There are different levels of player-strength in the various PGA Sections, therefore, a system has been developed to “weight” all Sections according to the overall playing ability of their PGA Professionals – not who has the best players, but which Sections have the most quality players. After all Sections are weighted, they are divided into four groups and this determines how many players within each Section receive points according to their final ranking on their respective “Section Player of the Year” point list. In other words, “stronger” Sections have access to more points, and more of their players earn these points.

The following formula is used:

- a. 33% - Total number of PGA Professional Championship-eligible members in the Section (at beginning of current fiscal year – July 1).
- b. 33% - Total number of Section entries into their respective current year’s Section PGA Professional Championships.
- c. 33% - Total number of Section players making the 36-hole cut at the current year’s PGA Professional Championship.

Points earned in the above are assigned to the calendar year WHEN INCURRED.

All 41 Sections are ranked 1 through 41 in all three of the above categories. After the results from these three criteria are added, the Sections are ranked 1 through 41 by their totals. (i.e., lowest to highest).

Ideally, all Sections are then divided into four equal-size groups of ten each (11 for Group A), and the following points are awarded to the top players from the various Section “Player of the Year” rankings. In the case of a tie, or ties, the sections are divided into Groups, possibly not of equal size, but what is deemed to be the “most-fair” manner.

The 41 Sections are divided into four divisions. Group “A” is considered the “strongest” and 15 of their players receive points. In Group “B”, 12 players are rewarded, followed by “C” with 9 and “D” with 6. The 1st place in all four groups receives the same number of points but differ thereafter down the list.

A* – Points diminish in one-point increments for everyone making the cut.

B* – Points diminish in one-point increments for everyone making the 54-hole cut. (All “cut” players receive 15 points from qualifying)

C* – Points diminish in 1 ½ and 1 point increments for ties at 25th.

D* – Points diminish in four-point increments for ties at 39th.

Note:

Players turning age 50 mid-calendar year may accumulate points toward their Senior POY total from all events played during the year, even if some points were accumulated while they were still 49. The eligibility criteria for this situation are that the player must turn 50 during that specific year **and** must participate in a PGA of America National Senior Championship (i.e. Senior PGA Professional Championship).

A* – Points diminish in two-point increments for everyone making the cut.

D* – Points diminish in one-point increments for everyone making the cut.

Eligibility:

- Must be a Woman PGA Member in good standing and in an eligible classification.
- Points can only be earned as a Woman PGA Member (i.e. an Associate that plays well in the PGA Winter Championships - Women's Stroke Play Championship will not earn points.)

Section Tournaments: These points are based on women's participation in Section individual events. For an event to be eligible to count as a points event, it must be run by the Section and the Section must report the results within three (3) business days of the conclusion of the Championship. Points will be based on final money earned from participating in individual Section events.

There are different levels of player-strength in the various PGA Sections, therefore, a system has been developed to "weight" all Sections according to the overall number of women PGA Professionals in each Section (not who has the best players), but which Sections have the most PGA women members. After all Sections are weighted, they are divided into four groups and this determines how many players within each Section would receive points

according to their final money rankings. In other words, Sections with more women Professionals have access to more points, and more of their players earn these points.

The following formula will be used:

$$100\% - \text{Total number of eligible PGA members in the Section (beginning January 1, 2019)}.$$

All 41 Sections are ranked 1 through 41 in the above category. The Sections are ranked 1 through 41 by their totals (i.e. highest to lowest). All Sections are then divided into four equal-size groups of ten each (11 for Group A), and the following points are awarded to the top players from the various Section rankings. In the case of a tie, or ties, the sections are divided into Groups, possibly not of equal size, but what is deemed to be the “most-fair” manner.

The 41 Sections are divided into four divisions. Group “A” has the largest number of women PGA Professionals and 10 of their players receive points. In Group “B”, 7 players are rewarded, followed by “C” with 4 and “D” with 3. The 1st place in all four groups receives the same number of points but differ thereafter down the list.

Section Responsibilities:

At the conclusion of a Section’s Individual event in which a woman PGA member plays well and finishes in the top 20 places or ties for 20th place and earns money, the Section would send those results to the PGA of America headquarters to be tracked.
